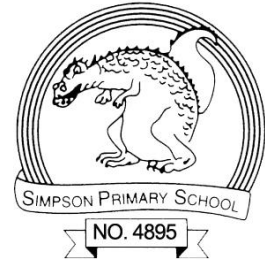

Sounds-Write

Our school implements the Sounds-Write program at 9am every morning as part of a Structured Literacy Program. Sounds-Write involves 30 minute daily explicit teaching and practice in phonological awareness and phonic knowledge skills and understandings.

Sounds-Write is effective in teaching pupils to read, spell and write, because it starts from what all children know from a very early age - the sounds of their own language. From there, it takes them in carefully sequenced, incremental steps and teaches them how each of the 44 or so sounds in the English language can be spelt. The words used in the teaching process and the conceptual knowledge of how the alphabet code works are introduced from simple to complex, in accordance with the fundamental principles of psychological learning theory.

Sounds-Write provides opportunities for practising skills on a daily basis until pupils achieve the automaticity required for fluent reading and spelling. Below is a link explaining 'What is Sounds-Write', 'What decodable readers?' and 'How you can support your child using decodable readers'.

Prep News

Wow! The Preps have nearly completed their first Term of School. So many firsts for each one of them. Preps have been working hard with improvement made in the following areas throughout the term, routines, listening to and following instructions and stamina.

The students have been keeping a check of how many days we have been at school, and they are getting closer to 50, which is halfway, to our target of celebrating 100 days.

Literacy

The students are able to recall and write many of our new sounds (i, a, s, m, t, n, o, p, b, c, g, h, d, e, f, v). Some are beginning to blend the sounds to say a word and recognise these words when reading. The formation of their sounds is improving, and our names are more recognisable with less letters missing, being reversed and capital letters in the middle of names.

Numeracy

After completing lessons on pattern, length and place value we are finishing the Term with a focus on shape. The students (with the help of Miss Theodore) are learning to identify basic shapes in the environment and recognise the differences by counting the sides and corners of the shape. It has been a very busy Term with students participating in Gymnastics, PMP, Science, Auslan, P.E, Library and Art. Library and Art will continue next term on Wednesday, alternating from week to week.

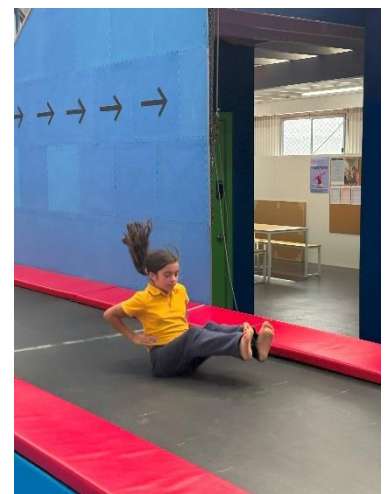
Athletics Sports

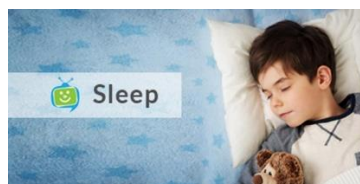

Student Wellbeing



Students today have extremely busy schedules, with ever increasing responsibilities at school and at home. Many kids, especially adolescents, are going to bed later and later and are at risk of sleep deprivation. This affects three areas of a child's development: psychological, physiological and psychosocial. All three are

essential to a child's growth, learning ability and overall wellbeing. Sleep is vital to a child's overall development and is as important as diet and exercise.

Sleep also strengthens a child's immune systems and supports their ability to function properly on a daily basis. Children who do not get enough sleep show increased levels of aggressive behaviour, are less attentive and are much less active. Trying to catch up on sleep on weekends is not the answer and can still lead to severe sleep deprivation.

Notes & Annual Reminders

Policies:

CSEF Funding:

Families who hold health care cards are eligible for CSEF support funding each year. Please check in at school to make sure your family is eligible for this funding support in 2025. This process needs to be done by 28th June. Please see the information later in the newsletter.

Parent/Visitor Sign In:

All parents or visitors who are coming into the school for more than 10 minutes are required to sign in. You will need to sign in and out of the visitor register at the office. This allows us to account for you in the event of an emergency.

Uniform:

We ask that you ensure your child is in uniform each day to continue the high standards we set for ourselves. Hats are to be worn until the end of Term 1, and again in Term 4, so please ensure your child has a broad brimmed hat (named) available every day. Those students without a hat must remain under cover, for the duration of recess and lunchtime. If your child requires a new hat, they can be purchased through the front office. Uniform orders can also be purchased from the office.

Named Clothing:

Parents are asked to check that clothing is clearly named. **If you have second-hand clothes, please check that the name has been changed.** If clothes are correctly named, we have some hope of returning items to the correct owners. All lost property of students will be stored at the front office where there are currently quite a few items. Please check to see if you are missing any items so they can be returned.

Communication:

If you need to speak with your child's teacher, please contact the office for an appointment or alternatively send your teacher an email. Please note: Staff are often busy in the mornings prior to instruction time, preparing for the day ahead. Staff also have meeting commitments after school on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons from 3.30pm onwards and therefore it is not always possible to meet after school on these days. If you have an urgent concern about your child regarding any start of year questions or concerns, please make contact through the office.

Daily Routine:

School commences at 8.55am and ends at 3.15pm. Students should not arrive at school before 8.45am. Students should leave promptly at 3.15pm at the end of the day. At 8:53am, the music is played; this signifies to the students that they should move into their classroom and prepare themselves for the daily learning. Recess: 10.55am – 11.25am. Lunch: 1.25pm – 1.35pm (supervised eating) and 1:35pm – 2.15pm (lunch play). 3:15pm is the end of the school day. Staff members are on duty until buses leave and town students collected.

Late Arrivals:

Students arriving after 8:55am should report to the office. Office staff will record their attendance as a late arrival and students will then go to class. Parents will be contacted by the principal if lateness is becoming a problem.

Early Departure:

If you wish to collect your child from school before dismissal time, they must be signed out at the office. This ensures all students can be accounted for in the case of an emergency. To assist, please phone the office prior to collecting your child so they can be ready for collection.

Breakfast Club:

Breakfast Club are on Mondays from 8.45am. If you would like to help with Breakfast Club, please contact the office. Breakfast Club will resume Week 2 of Term 2 Monday April 28th.


Music Lessons:
